Have you heard the question "Is the glass half full or half empty?" When driving vehicles that are roughly 50 years old, it is safe to say that we will have issues. Our challenge is to look for the good when bad things happen.

Last week Becky and I attended the Great Lakers rally at Maumee Bay state park in Ohio. This rally, hosted by Faye and Dan Smith, brought together 26 GMCs of our members as well as 2 who came in their SOBs, making it the highest attended Great Lakers rally in a decade. We even ran into another GMC at the campground who wasn't a Great Laker – I'll bet he was surprised by his campground neighbors.

At the beginning of the rally, when I greeted **Dave and Mary Lenzi** with "How you doing?", Dave's response really got my attention. "We're doing good...now". The "now" was a word that called for an explanation. It turns out that the transmission in Dave's GMC had a failure on his way home from a work rally he attended in Minnesota. He was able to limp the rig home and had just finished reinstalling his repaired transmission the day before our rally. That was why it was important to say "...now". Think about how different things would have been if instead the failure would have left him stranded hundreds of miles from home.

I mentioned earlier that two of our members came to the rally in SOBs rather than their GMCs. Marcia and Cary Lawson were on their way home from our September rally at Addison Oaks when their transmission stopped shifting into third gear. Like Dave, Cary was able to limp his rig home but he wasn't able to get it fixed in time to drive it to Maumee. No problem. We were glad that Cary and Marcia were able to join us, even if it was in

their SOB instead of their GMC. Cary found a shop near his home that understands our THM425 transmission so I expect we will hear from him in the spring what the issue was

The other SOB at our rally belongs to new members Jim and Darlene Fetherolf. They had attended their first Great Lakers rally at the Pinery in Canada in August in their

GMC and made it home OK. However, on their way to Maumee, disturbing engine noises from the GMC caused Jim to turn around and go home where he switched vehicles rather than risk a catastrophic failure. Like the Lawson's, we were glad they could attend even if we would have preferred to see another GMC. Now Jim has the entire winter to get things taken care of.

My last example of motorhome troubles at the October rally involves John and Melissa Koenig discovering a puddle of engine coolant under their GMC when they arrived at Maumee. Apparently, while they were in route, something kicked up from the road and damaged their radiator, causing a geyser of coolant to squirt out of the punctured cooling tube. After getting situated at their campsite, and before our pot-luck dinner, an effort to band-aid their damaged rig began so that two days later they would be able to safely make the 80-mile trip back home. Bob Lambert found just the right spots to pinch off the damaged tube with a pair of pliers, reducing the leak to drips rather than a stream. After dinner, a quick trip to the store for a container of Stop Leak provided the finishing touch to the temporary fix, eliminating the leak for their drive home. I was able to confirm with John after the rally that their trip home was uneventful and that he now has the radiator removed and undergoing a permanent repair at his local radiator shop.

If the glass is half empty, each of these incidents could scare us into staying home instead of travelling in the GMCs we love. I like to think that the glass is half full and that these experiences tell us that although there may be bumps in the road, it will work out in the end.

I hope to see you all at our next rally in your GMCs in May 2025.

May

Dutch Treat Campground Holland, MI May 15th to 18th, 2025

Call 616-772-4303 for a reservation. but they usually have plenty available in May. We suggest reserving in January.

June

Elkhart RV Campground Granger, IN June 19th to 22nd, 2025

Call 509-957-2941 for a reservation. The line is staffed 9 to 5, Monday-Friday; ask for Auturo. They are not holding sites so make your reservation early.

July

Chain O Lakes Campground Bellaire, MI July 17th to 20th, 2025

They are holding 20 sites for us until January 1st. After that they are open to the public. Call 231-533-8432 for a reservation; ask for Cameo and mention that you are with the Great Lakers.



August

Groveland Oaks County Park Holly, MI August 13th to 20th, 2025

We have a group site for 20 coaches - your camping fee will be included in the rally fee. After the first 20 coaches register with us you will need to book your site directly through the park.

September

Algonac State Park Algonac, MI September 11th to 14th, 2025

This is a return of the Do Nothing Rally in a completely refurbished campground. Make your reservation through the Michigan DNR website by March to get a site near the riverside.


August 2024 Great Lakers Rally Pinery Provincial Park: Grand Bend, Ontario Canada

Faye was certainly hostess extrordinaire! For the crafters in our group, she offered a card and gift-tag make and take session. And for our breakfasts she baked 4 batches of **Pumpkin Muffins**, about 80 in all. Below is the recipe for those who requested it:

2 cups pumpkin puree
3 cups flour
2 cups sugar
2 tsp. baking soda
½ tsp. baking powder
2 tsp. ground cloves
2 tsp. cinnamon
2 tsp. nutmeg
1 tsp. allspice
1 tsp. salt
2/3 cup vegetable oil



Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
Grease or line muffin cups.
In a large bowl, stir together flour, sugar, baking soda, baking powder, salt and the spices.
In a separate bowl, beat together pumpkin, oil and the eggs.
Stir the wet mixture into the flour mixture until smooth.
Scoop into the muffin cups.
Bake for about 20 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean.
Makes approx. 20 muffins - They freeze very well.
