President's Page

Sometimes I think we have a tendency to forget just how good we've got it. An experience that I had back in September reinforced this thought for me. First, a little background.

I worked my entire career for General Motors starting full time at their Tech Center in Warren, Michigan in 1978 at the conclusion of my college co-op engineering degree program at General Motors Institute (today known as Kettering University). In 1985, I reluctantly took a job assignment at their Proving Grounds in Milford, Michigan which at the time I feared might sidetrack the advancement of my engineering career at GM. Thirty-one years later, I was still working at the Proving Grounds when I retired. A side-track to the Proving Grounds became the job I loved and never wanted to leave. For the last few years of my working career, I was able to "threaten" my boss during my annual performance review that I would immediately retire if they tried to transfer me to a job within the company located anywhere else.

The Milford Proving Grounds was created by GM back in 1924 to develop and test all of their vehicles, including our cherished motorhome. On September 21, 2024 the Proving Grounds held an Open House to celebrate 100 years of operations and invited GM employees and retirees to attend with their families. Part of the festivities was a classic car show held on their vehicle dynamics pad, 67 acres of asphalt used for handling development tests. Becky and I displayed our 1977 Eleganza amongst about 200 classic vehicles. As you can imagine, like many car shows, this one had a lot of muscle cars (Corvettes, Camaros, Mustangs, Chargers) with some being concours level samples easily worth well over \$100,000. There were cars ranging from almost new mid-engine Corvettes to 100+ year old cars (a couple Ford Model T's and a Cadillac) with a mix of anything and everything in between.

When we arrived for the show, the organizers parked us

next to the only other GMC motorhome in attendance since they figured we must have known each other. It turns out we didn't – the other owner was a GM retiree who came from Oxford, Michigan. I put out our coach awnings and grabbed our lawn chairs, prepared to answer a few questions from attendees who we thought might be curious, before we ventured out to look over the rest of the show.

Seven hours later, it seemed like we had hosted in our GMC most of the 8,000 people who attended the event. We separately took a few minutes to quickly see some of the other vehicles and displays that GM put together, but most of the time we were both engaged in conversations by our coach with some of the attendees. I'm convinced that our GMC attracted more attention than any of the immaculate Corvettes parked nearby. Most people with a car at an event like this would say "look but don't touch" but we said "come inside and look around". Kids loved our Barbie GMC and the Hot Wheels GMCs that Becky brought to show. Their parents marveled that we actually camp in a classic. Several asked how they could buy one.

When the car show finished and it was time to head home, we had an opportunity to drive on several of the Proving Grounds test roads that were part of a selfguided road tour to celebrate the 100th Anniversary. The coolest part was driving the GMC on the banked turn-around at the end of the 3 mile long straightaway that runs along one side of the property. The last track we drove the GMC on before exiting the Proving Grounds was a portion of the Milford Road Course, essentially a private race track used to develop high speed handling.

The next time you get an opportunity to show off your GMC, take it. Don't fret about its flaws – they will be overlooked by envious onlookers. Our experience definitely reminded us how good we've got it.



Joe's Tech Corner

Parking your coach for the winter is rough! The keys are just sitting on the counter gathering dust. Well don't despair, there are a few things you can do to keep your GMC from getting cold and lonely.

• Start your coach at least once a month to keep the oil circulating.

• Pump your brakes to keep the brake cylinder and master cylinder moving.

• Check for water leaks. Even the best kept coaches get them. When it's too cold for repairs I put towels and buckets in place until favorable weather is upon us.

- Create your "Things to do list" for 2025.
- Start signing up for Great Lakers rallies!

• Check the age of your tires. A maximum of seven years is a good age to replace them regardless of treadwear.

• Have you aligned your headlights?

• Check your records to see when the wheel bearings were last repacked.

• Check the water pump to see if it's weeping any coolant. The little hole under the front bearing will provide your first and only clue it's about to go.

• Check your battery ground connections and do an under-hood wire inspection. Look particularly at the purple power line to the fan as it is known to melt.

• It's a good time to order parts for next year.

• I got a great idea from Jeff Ryder. I am going to make a summer storage bonnet for our GMC front end out of an existing car cover I have laying around. This will help minimize damaging sun rays to the paint. As you may know, tarps are too abrasive and will chafe your nice paint job.

• Book sites at state and provincial campgrounds six months ahead to "lock in" your campsites!
